“Time”

How many times when we’re waiting for something to come and it seems like it is an eternity for that thing to come. Or we want something done and it takes forever for that person to get it done for you. If you’re like me, sometimes we say, “What are you waiting for? Christmas!

It wasn’t that long ago, maybe six months or so, when Karen and I were discussing Karen’s retirement. We came up with a date of November 20th of this year. It seemed like such a long time for it to come, but here we are. As you are reading this Newsletter, she is officially retired. I’ve (Dwayne) also set a date for my official retirement, Lord willing, to be January 31, 2027. That seems like a long time, but it will be here before I know it.

In the Book of Isaiah, chapter 7, verse 14 it says this: “Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: *“The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.”* In Isaiah chapter 9, verse 6 it says; *“For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.”* These prophecies were written 700 years before it happened. As the people were waiting for the fulfillment of these prophecies it must have seemed like forever.

Then it happened. We’re told in the Book of Matthew, chapter one how it all came about.


18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. 19 Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. 20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give

him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.” 22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 “The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel”—which means, “God with us.” 24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus” (Matthew 1:18-25).

All throughout the Old Testament, this was prophesied. And we can read in the Gospel of Matthew and see how it all transpired. It’s been over 2000 years since the birth of Jesus. It was fulfilled just as it was told it would be. This was the first Advent. Now we wait for the second Advent. This is when Jesus will come back for us. This too is prophesied. It seems like it will never happen. But it will be here before we know it.

Let us all be ready for that day!
