"Set Our Minds Above"

In the Book of Colossians, chapter 3, verses 1-4, it says this: 1 "Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. 3 For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. 4 When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." The Apostle Paul is urging us as Christians to stay centered on our identity and authority in Christ. He tells us in verse two to "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things."

Many of you know that one of my hobbies is to hunt. I especially like to hunt whitetail deer. Turkey hunting is also fun but I don't pursue it as much as hunting deer. And my favorite weapon of choice would be with a bow and arrow although using a gun is close behind. The point is I spend time chasing the elusive whitetail. Maybe sometimes too much time. Like all hobbies we can spend a lot of time chasing them. Paul had explained this in another letter: "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Phil 4:8).

Let's set our minds on Jesus and enjoy the things He's given us to enjoy!

Being Filled with the Holy Spirit



I have been studying our relationship with the Holy Spirit here recently and I wanted to share a few things with you about the Holy Spirit.

Our relationship with the Holy Spirit sometimes gets overlooked. One of the great truths of the Christian life is that **every believer receives the Holy Spirit at the moment of salvation**. The Spirit indwells us permanently, seals us in Christ, and empowers us to live as God's children. This is a settled reality for all who are in Christ.

At the same time, Scripture makes clear that the Christian life is meant to be lived in **ongoing dependence upon the Holy Spirit**. In Ephesians 5:18, Paul commands believers, "... *be filled with the Spirit*" (NASB 1995). This command is written in a way that implies a continual, ongoing filling—not a one-time experience, but a repeated, daily reality.

Throughout the New Testament, we see believers who already knew Christ experiencing **fresh fillings of the Holy Spirit**—resulting in boldness, assurance, power for witness, and endurance in the face of difficulty. These moments were not about emotional excess, but about God supplying exactly what His people needed to glorify Christ and advance the gospel.

Church history confirms this same pattern. Spirit-filled believers are marked by **faithfulness, courage, perseverance, and effectiveness** in ministry. When God's people walk in step with the Spirit, the church is strengthened and Christ is exalted.

My prayer for Maple Grove Community Church is that we would be a people who are **rooted in Scripture, dependent on the Spirit, and bold in our witness**—not trusting in our own strength, but in the power God graciously supplies.

Peanut Butter Brownies

1/2 cup butter	1/2 cup peanut butter
1 cup sugar	2 eggs
1/2 cup brown sugar	1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup flour	1 tsp. baking powder
1 cup oatmeal	1 cup chocolate chips

Cream butters and sugars together with eggs. Add the rest of the ingredients. Spread into a greased cookie sheet with sides. Bake at 350 degrees until done, 25 minutes or so.

Icing:

3 cups powdered sugar	1/2 cup peanut butter
1/2 cup butter	

Mix together. Add water until it's a spreading consistency.

I've heard a lot of people loving Andrea Byler's Peanut Butter Brownies, so I twisted her arm to share the recipe. Let me know if there are other recipes you'd like me to try to get.
